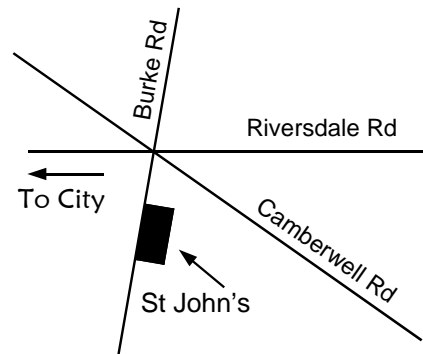

MONASH SINFONIA

Monash Sinfonia is a select string orchestra that presents the string students of Monash School of Music – Conservatorium performing ensemble works from the string repertoire. Formed in 1996, the group has played at BMW Edge, Federation Square and Robert Blackwood Hall and in 2005 launched the prestigious L'Oreal Ball at ACMI. Developing independence of thought in students is a hallmark of the ensemble and the group often plays un-conducted. Another feature of the ensemble is staff/student collaborations including examples such as the 2007 Music in the Round festival performance of the Mendelssohn Octet with Melbourne Symphony Orchestra concertmaster, Wilma Smith. Sinfonia has also appeared with outstanding artists such as Paul Wright, Jeffrey Crellin and Miki Tsunoda. Future performances include concerts in China and Italy.

GLORIANA CHAMBER CHOIR

Gloriana is one of Melbourne's foremost Chamber Choirs, founded in 1994 by its director Andrew Raiskums. Gloriana's programs traverse a wide range of genres and styles but focus on the a cappella performance of Renaissance and contemporary choral music. The warmth and excellence of the choir's performances have been regularly praised by audiences and critics alike. Writing recently of the choir, Age reviewer Clive O'Connell said that "you could successfully put up the Gloriana voices against any similar group in the country". The choir is regularly heard on 3MBS and Classic FM and in addition to its own concert series, this year the choir has performed in the Promenade of Sacred Music in Hamilton and sang the closing concert in the Organs of the Ballarat Goldfields Festival.

MELBA CONSERVATORIUM OF MUSIC

Divas and Dramas

Memorable moments from opera, operetta and music theatre presented by past and present students of the Melba Conservatorium.

The programme will include arias, songs and ensembles by Mozart, Rossini, Donizetti, Strauss, Loesser, Anderson and Sondheim.

Mozart is represented by three of his greatest works: from *The Magic Flute* comes the exquisite duet, 'Bei Männern', for Pamina and Papageno; the lecherous Don Giovanni attempts the seduction of the peasant girl Zerlina; while from *Così fan tutte* we have the hauntingly beautiful trio 'Soave sia il vento'. Rossini's *Italian Girl in Algiers* provides the opportunity for bravura singing on the part of the mezzo in the aria 'Cruda Sorte' as does 'O luce di quest'anima' for the soprano in *Linda di Chamounix* by Donizetti. The lachrymose Adelaide sniffs and coughs her way through her 'Lament' from *Guys and Dolls*, while *Miss Saigon* is represented by the duet between Kim and Ellen. Perennial favourite *Die Fledermaus* will showcase the maid Adele's talents and a medley from *My Fair Lady* will remind us of why this musical is so well loved.

JENNIFER CHOU Organist

Jennifer Chou is Director of Music at St John's Anglican Church Camberwell. Originally from Hong Kong, she was educated in Hong Kong, the United States and France. She holds Master of Music and Performance Certificate degrees from Northwestern University, and Prix d'excellence, Prix de virtuosité, and premier prix in organ from conservatoires of music in France. Her mentors were Wolfgang Riebsam, Susan Landale, Michel Bouvard and Jan Willem Jansen. Jennifer performed complete Buxtehude organ works throughout 2007 at St John's Sunday services. The program will comprise major excerpts from the great organ work composed by Olivier Messiaen in 1984—'Livere du Saint Sacrement' (The book of the Holy Sacrement).
