Introducing our new Vicar – Father John Baldock

As announced last Sunday, the Reverend John Baldock has accepted appointment as the next Incumbent of St John’s Camberwell. He will be inducted by Bishop Genieve Blackwell on Tuesday 21 August at 7pm.

Father Baldock is currently the Vicar of St John’s and St Agnes’ Anglican Parish, East Malvern, where he has been for the past 12 years. He is an active member of General Synod, the Diocesan Synod, the Diocesan Council and the Diocese’s Finance Committee.

He was ordained priest in Melbourne in 1985, having been trained for the priesthood at St Barnabas’ College, Adelaide, and St John’s College, Morpeth. This will be the fifth time he has been in charge of a parish.

He is a Bachelor of Arts from Newcastle University and a Master of Public Policy from Deakin University.

At St John’s East Malvern, Father Baldock is also Chaplain of the Caulfield Campus of Monash University, part of the community engagement and strong sense of mission and identity he has developed in the parish.

He has also spent 20 years in senior management positions within national and international non-government organisations, both religious and secular. For instance, in 1996-9 he was the Associate Secretary-General, Religions for Peace (WCRP) in New York, having established a similar organisation in Australia, between 1989-1996.

Some of the highlights of his time in his current parish have included –

- The initiation of the ‘Faith in our Future’ appeal for Trinity College Theological School, Melbourne University, raising more than \$500,000 for theological education in the past two years;
 - The ‘Globe Café’ – a weekly outreach program to international students, now in its eleventh year;
 - Initiated ‘St Jack’s’, a free weekly lunch program for the vulnerable and homeless; and
 - Developed a successful concert program at St John’s.
- John is married to Carolyn Simm. They have three children, Thomas, Griffin and Madele.

We look forward to welcoming him as our vicar and pastor.

ANOTHER WOMAN BISHOP IN MELBOURNE: The Archbishop has appointed another woman, the Revd Kate Prowd, as an assistant bishop in this Diocese. She will be consecrated on 6 October – the Feast of St Faith – to become the Bishop of the Oodthenong Episcopate, currently held by Bishop Philip Huggins, who is retiring. Ms Prowd, whose ministry roles have been mainly in chaplaincy, was the first woman ordained in Melbourne direct from ordination training at Trinity College Theological School. She is also a highly qualified practicing psychologist.

EFM 'TASTER' SESSIONS BEGIN TODAY: Fr Greg Davies, the national director of Education For Ministry Australia, will present the first of three 'taster' EFM sessions this morning, following the Sung Eucharist. The second and third 'tasters' will be next Sunday, 8 July and then the following Sunday, 15 July. Each session will take about an hour. They will enable parishioners to experience EFM first-hand before the parish decides whether to commit to the full program. And Fr Greg has generously offered to mentor a parish group in its initial stages if we decide to introduce one. Please make every effort to come.

CHILD SAFETY IN THE PARISH:

Thank you to the many parishioners who have already signed their commitment to the Diocese's Child Safety Code of Conduct. The commitments will be kept on file in the parish office. A flyer outlining how the parish is implementing the new Diocesan regulations on child safety are on the narthex table. These new rules will have an impact on almost all parishioners, specifically Synod representatives, Churchwardens, Parish Councillors, pastoral care visitors both in homes and aged care facilities, intercessors, readers, Eucharistic assistants, servers, choir members, welcomers, and providers of after-church refreshments. If you are in any of these roles, you should already have received a named envelope containing a copy of the Code of Conduct. If you have not, please speak to Muriel Porter.

To continue in these parish roles, you must agree to be bound by the Code of Conduct by signing it in front of a designated parish witness. This can be done following the Sunday morning liturgies on 22 or 29 July. The deadline for signing is 1 August.

Some parishioners, such as pastoral care visitors and choir members and some others, will also require **current** police and Working With Children checks. You will be contacted by the parish office if you need these.
