In Jesus' first sermon in Nazareth he announces that, empowered by the Spirit of the Lord, he will bring good news to the poor, proclaim release to the captives, give recovery of sight to the blind and freedom to the oppressed. All this is the proclamation of the year of the Lord's favour (Luke 4:18-19). Now, having called disciples to him from amongst the crowd who follow him, Jesus is preaching another sermon, telling his listeners about God's overturning of human expectations. In today's Gospel reading we hear the end of this sermon where Jesus teaches that his community, based on the reign of the love of God, is to demonstrate a radically different way of seeing life and of ordering human behaviour.
