Candlemas—The Presentation of Christ in the Temple—5 February 2017

My Dear Friends,

Candlemas is often described as a kind of 'hinge' in the church's year: one last look back to the Crib; turning around to face the Cross. Though still a new-born, the prophetic utterances of Simeon over the 40 day old Jesus are, to our culture's way of thinking, quite shocking. The child called 'holy' is "destined for the rising and falling of many... a sign to be opposed." Passion and crucifixion are the vocation for this infant! Not only is the child so destined. His mother is to have her soul pierced!

It's crucial to appreciate that this story speaks not so much of religious propositions, ideas to be believed in; but of spiritual experience. The 'presentation of Christ in the Temple' is not something to be 'believed in'; rather, it's the poetic expression of the ineffable experience, the personal encounter with the transcendent. This fact makes all the difference.

This is what makes the difference between tame adherence to doctrines, to religious statements and propositions (anyone can manage that), and the wild experience of encounter, of going on the way, of spiritual journey.

This infant is to undergo a way, to discover by experience what is the truth of God and humankind. He will not discover his Son-ship merely by studying Torah scrolls and passing a bible test; but by being driven into the wilderness of his own soul, there to discover his own dark potential.

This old man Simeon is not a retired executive still attempting to flex his muscles and control his world, just as he did in his virile years; but the wise man who has discerned that relinquishment, detachment is the way to life.

This mother is not the model wife preening herself at the tennis club; but the courageous, pioneering woman whose consent to bear the Cross-bound divine will also cost her not less than everything, the piercing of the soul.

Candlemas invites us into this wild experience with God, of being disciples: the piercing of our souls, relinquishment, wilderness. Notice that both Simeon and Anna have been hanging around the Temple, for a long time. Not because they are pious goody-two-shoes; but because meaningful encounter is a function of readiness, openness.

Candlemas invites us to be open to the wild and untameable experience of the Divine call, to present ourselves, all that we have and are, for transformation. In the words of the great 20<sup>th</sup> century theologian Karl Rahner: "Since Christ does not release us from his fate, let us hope that we will discover in our association with the sacrament of his heart what we will be and what we actually are."
