ST JOHN’S ANGLICAN CHURCH, CAMBERWELL
Pentecost 7—8 July 2018

On the 14th of July 1833 an English Churchman John Keble delivered the Assize Sermon which is generally held to be the starting point of Catholic Revival of the Church of England. The sermon didn’t make much of an immediate impact but it was a clear call to for the church to claim its own authority rather than being simply an arm of the state. While not many of us may know anything about this sermon we will have sung at least one of Keble’s hymns; ‘Blest are the pure in heart’ and we may have even visited Keble College in Oxford.

This claiming of the church’s own authority that occurred in England at the time had implications for the church there and in every church across the world that had its origins in English Anglicanism. The church as we know would be very different if the Oxford movement with its catholic revival of the church had not taken place. From this movement flowed a re-establishment of the Eucharist as central in our worship; an approach to scripture that held in tension scripture, reason and tradition thus enabling modern scholarship and deeper understanding of the scriptures to be established.

John Keble’s Assize sermon recognised an opportunity that presented itself in his time. He must have been very courageous as his bold and assured leadership gave confidence to the church then and in the generations that have followed to embrace our shared Christian history and move forward to new understandings and practices that will enrich the church in the present and in the years to come.

Keble was a renowned writer and poet; he wrote *The Christian Year* first published in 1827 and by 1863 there had been 109 editions of this significant book. He had a vast influence on the spiritual life of many people in the church of his day and of every generation since.

Each year Keble is remembered in our diocese, this year the service will be at Christ Church Brunswick on Monday the 16th of July commencing at 7.30p.m., everyone is invited to attend.

CHILD SAFETY IN THE PARISH – Working with Children and Police checks

Parishioners whose ministry roles now require them to have Working with Children and/or Police checks under the Diocese's new Child Safety regulations should by now have received a letter from the Parish Administrator outlining their requirements. The letter lists two dates when the Office Assistant, Mrs Laura Hewitson, will be available to help with applications for these checks — next Tuesday, 10 July, and Wednesday week, 18 July, between 10am and 5pm (last appointment 4.30pm). Parishioners seeking her help **MUST** make an appointment either by email assistant@stjohnscamberwell.org.au or by phoning the parish office (9882 4851). When you make your booking you will be advised of the specific ID requirements which you will need to bring.

A number of parishioners in a range of ministry roles still need to sign their commitment to the Diocese's Child Safety Code of Conduct in front of a designated parish witness. This can be done on Sundays 22 and 29 July. If this is not possible, other arrangements can be made. Please speak to Muriel Porter. To continue in the specified parish roles, you must sign by **1 August** at the latest.
