The Archbishop has requested that this information be made known to the church in our diocese:

PNG EARTHQUAKE APPEAL – ANGLICAN BOARD OF MISSION ABM has launched an emergency appeal for the people of Papua New Guinea in response to the magnitude 7.5 earthquake which struck the Southern Highlands province on 26 February, causing landslides, destroying buildings and widespread damage. It is estimated that at least 67 people have been killed, and about 150,000 are in need of urgent humanitarian assistance. ABM is aiming to raise \$50,000 to assist the Anglican Church of PNG with the emergency response. NEWTON THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE PNG APPEAL – ANGLICAN BOARD OF MISSION Former Archbishop of Adelaide, Bishop Jeffrey Driver has alerted me to the pressing need to strengthen the operation of Newton Theological College, Popondetta, Papua New Guinea. Bishop Driver has committed to strengthening the College (the national theological college for the Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea) and he now spends a significant period there over the course of the year teaching and strengthening the college's educational administration. Newton College is relatively isolated and somewhat distant from both the town and airport of Popondetta. The College has no means of transport and Bishop Driver advises the provision of a vehicle for the college's use is mission critical for its continued operation. He is working on arranging for visiting lecturers to come to Newton College from Australia and considers this will be untenable without a means of moving people in both routine and emergency circumstances. He tells me that a suitable vehicle could be purchased locally and second hand for between \$20,000 and \$25,000.

The worship at St. John's during Holy week reaching its conclusion with The Triduum liturgy has been a wonderful experience. Many members of our community made a variety of generous contributions that have assisted us to worship with an intensity of purpose and commitment. Let us continue to appreciate each other and to value one another's unique contributions in our shared spiritual journey that we commenced on Ash Wednesday and now celebrate in the Easter Season.

Christ is Risen. Alleluia Alleluia.
