ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH, CAMBERWELL
Pentecost 3—10 June 2018

One of the great theological minds of our time belongs to the previous Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams. Rowan's writing is not all that easy to grasp as he always seems to come at issues from an unexpected position and to discuss them in ways that can be both confronting and perplexing. The historical background to each stage of Rowan's development as a theologian alerts the reader to the other influences that are at work in his writings.

As Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan has written and spoken often on the subject of the mission of the church; among his comments can be found a challenge to all the church to be involved in mission however his understanding of mission is profound and transcends the often held understanding of mission as an activity that tells people what to believe and how to act. Rowan challenges the church to go out, in fact he insists that the church has no option about mission but to be active in it.-to go out and identify with the presence of Christ already existing in human life and society. He says that when the church is doing this it will come to a deeper understanding and appreciation of its own identity.

One of the many challenges of the church and contemporary Christianity is how to express its identity, life and purpose in a multi faith or in a no faith environment. Rowan suggests that the church must keep being nurtured through the sacrament of the Eucharist as it is in this daily and or weekly ritual act of belonging that the church receives its identity from the Risen Christ. The Eucharist and the church's mission belong together and each depends on the other as we respond to God's love for us.
