We have heard and seen the pain people are carrying as a result of David's illness and the naming of the reasons behind it. It is entailed in reconciliation, that most Christian of practices, that shifts us from denial and disbelief to acceptance and change of life. Acknowledgement and forgiveness are our way forward, if we choose. Not to do so will leave community broken.

Lectio for the day

*Exodus 34.1-8; Song 3YM 29-34;
2 Corinthians 13.11-13; Matthew 28.16-20*

THIS MORNING'S PREACHER: Today Dr Wendy Crouch will preach at both the 8am and 10am liturgies, having this week received her approval from the Archbishop as an Authorised Honorary Parish Reader. This allows her to preach, distribute Communion, and assist with leading worship. She joins our two continuing honorary lay ministers, Verona Lea and Muriel Porter. Wendy will be formally presented with her certificate during the 10am liturgy. We congratulate her warmly.

CORPUS CHRISTI: THIS THURSDAY, 15 June.

The parish's annual Corpus Christi lecture will follow the 6.30pm Eucharist. Dr John D'Arcy May, a research fellow with the Irish School of Ecumenics, Trinity College, Dublin, and associated with a number of universities in Melbourne, will speak on 'Deep Ecumenism: Facing up to Religiously Motivated Violence'.

Dr May, who has recently published a book about his own ecumenical journey, will speak on how violence sanctioned by all three universal religions – Judaism, Islam and Christianity – is one of the greatest objections to religion in our time. How do we face up to the violence and learn to embrace a deep ecumenism, he asks?

As we reel from recent acts of terrorism, both overseas and closer to home, linked to religious ideology, this is a lecture not to be missed. All are welcome.
