Dear Friends,

Luke, perhaps more than the other evangelists, emphasises that Jesus' presence forces people to respond, to make choices: will they accept his offer of unconditional, gratuitous, reckless and profligate love; or not? On his "way to Jerusalem" we read again and again of how people respond to Jesus' offer.

We read in the gospel today that Pharisees and scribes are grumbling and complaining that Jesus is consorting with the wrong kind of people. As we read a few weeks ago, they are watching him in a manner which is like a bird of prey preparing for the kill. This is how religious conservatives always watch: ready to kill those deemed 'sinful'. Their obsession is 'sin'. This is because the god they have constructed is fixated on law, purity, perfection, moral cleanliness.

Jesus responds to this attitude with three parables in quick succession - the third of which is not included in today's lectionary selection, but which is by far the most famous, possibly the best known of all gospel stories. And what stands out most clearly is that, unlike the religious leaders, 'sin' is not Jesus' preoccupation. In all three parables Jesus reveals that God watches us in an entirely different manner. God does not see in the manner of the bird of prey ready to kill the sinful. The God Jesus knows does not see people primarily as sinful.

Lest this be misunderstood, let me be clear. Sin is a reality, yes, that all can observe. But there's a world of difference between seeing humankind as primarily 'sinful', and seeing humankind as primarily the object of love. Look at Jesus' parables: in every case the central action is searching and seeking, which leads to finding and rejoicing. Ninety-nine sheep are left so as to search for the one that is lost – no moral equation there. A house-wide search is undertaken for a single coin – no moral equation there. The moral equation is a preoccupation of a mind become disconnected from the heart. Searching and seeking is the work of the longing heart. In her search she sweeps the house and lights the lamp. In his search he ventures out into the wilderness for the sake of the precious one. Rejoicing is the climax!

This is God's way of 'watching' us, seeing us, says Jesus in the parables. Jesus offers us this vision of God and of ourselves, as fundamentally loved, as objects of the lover's searching and seeking, a Lover whose desire for us is fulfilled in rejoicing. The response to Jesus' offer is up to us.
