My Dear Friends,

"Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it."

Who can abide this absurd teaching? It feels impossible. Scandalous even. Certainly a complete nonsense in the eyes of what we call economics.

No one will buy it! We have a budget to manage!

Peter didn't buy it either. He wanted a religion of conquest, acquisition, and material security, certainty – probably like most of us. Jesus chastises him severely: Get used to it, the good news is an upside-down world.

Grasping, holding onto, it turns out, is the sure fire way to lose. Letting go, relinquishment (who would have thought!) is the way to life.

It feels so un-natural. Against nature. Definitely counter-cultural. Impossible even! Who can accomplish the impossible?

With God, he tells us...

But surely it cannot be right to die willingly, to let go of that which ought to be held onto?

The critical discernment question is this: how will we know what to hold onto, and what to relinquish?

Keep your eyes on Jesus. Look within, and know yourself.

Jesus shows us that the school of the *evangellion* (the gospel, the good news) is amazingly simple – yet simultaneously the most difficult thing we will ever accomplish.

It will take a lifetime.
