# ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH, CAMBERWELL

Twenty-sixth Sunday after Pentecost—13 November 2016

Dear Friends.

It is truly shocking that so many Americans apparently think that 'making America great again' means siding with a narcissist, condoning his unChristlike attitudes towards just about every category of outsider. Why are we in the midst of a global tidal wave of rising protectionism, fear-mongering, border closing, and generally regressive tendencies? How can it be, given that this is the generation with more education, more freedoms, more gadgets, and more 'sophistication' than any before us? There is talk of grass roots reactions against globalism, free trade, and porous borders; these 'articles of religion' of our times, it is suggested, have failed ordinary people. There *is* a growing economic and social divide everywhere. In the weeks and months ahead historians, political scientists, economists, sociologists and other experts will be explaining all this.

My question is, what do these things mean at the level of Spirit? What's going on, spiritually speaking? How do make sense of our time *spiritually*?

It helps to remember that we are in the midst of an evolutionary *aeon* shift. In every domain of life we are aware of rapid change and development. Marvelling at technological advances, and especially their rapidity, is standard conversational fare. But there is also lament and despair mingled with this marvelling. In one moment we delight in the capacity to communicate so readily with our friends and families on the other side of the planet. In the next moment we remonstrate that everyone on the train or tram seems to be incapable of conversation, glued to a small screen.

Spiritually speaking, we are in the midst of an upheaval of unprecedented proportions. While the technology can be adopted relatively easily, our souls are struggling to keep up with what is being demanded of them. At a very basic level, which we tend to overlook, we are still 'primitives' - who have been ripped away before time, so to speak, from 'the village', from the maternal ground of our being. Evolution is requiring of us advances in consciousness unimaginable even a generation ago. And so, as a species, we are under immense stress. When we look at it this way, it is perhaps not so surprising that when borders open up people become very frightened. And being frightened, become defensive, reactive, regressive – and, as we saw with our government this week, punitive even.

Yet evolution of spirit, like all evolution, advances through untidy and complex steps, spiralling forwards, backwards, forwards, in unexpected quantum leaps. Evolution is also non-reversible. The earth only rotates in one direction. The cosmos is expanding. The Spirit continues the creative work of earth-making. Her creative love can be resisted; but not thwarted.
