## VALE BISHOP JAMES GRANT

Bishop James Grant AM, a former regional bishop in Melbourne Diocese, and formerly Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, died suddenly last week. He was 87.

Bishop Grant was well known to many parishioners here through his various roles in the Diocese over his 60 years of ordained ministry. Between 1978 and 1985, he was St John's regional bishop when he was bishop of what was then called the Central Region. He left this role to become Dean of the Cathedral from 1985 until 1999, when he formally retired.

Retirement, however, saw Bishop Grant continue to exercise virtually a full-time ministry, particularly in his beloved alma mater, Trinity College. A fellow of the college where he had studied theology for ordination, he fulfilled various roles supporting both the college and its theological school. He was a familiar presence there. In his long-term parish, Christ Church, Brunswick, he was a member of the ministry team, regularly attending the daily Eucharist at which he presided twice weekly. Fittingly, he presided at the altar in his parish on the morning of the day he died.

We offer our sincere condolences and assurance of prayers to his widow, Rowena Armstrong AO QC, and to his many friends and colleagues throughout the Diocese. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.
