ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH, CAMBERWELL Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost—16 November 2014

Last week in her sermon Dorothy Lee mentioned that the parable of the ten young girls as one of those texts which preachers fear to draw in the lectionary selection of gospel texts for Sunday services. Today's passage, the parable of the talents, which immediately follows on from last week's reading, is another that the preacher needs to approach with caution in order to get the most out of it.

Caution is needed because the passage can be over-simplified into a moral lesson about honing our talents and making the most of them. While this is a worthy and positive reminder about being all that we can be, and refining our God-given talents to their best, the passage asks us to dig deeper than only making a surface reading.

When we dig deeper, taking the whole message of the parable into consideration, it becomes related to the *eschaton*, the end times, and a concept of final reckoning. The narrative of the talents becomes a parable about daily living, given the expectation of the end times, and there is a significant lesson within this passage as to how we are to live given the expectation of the *parousia*, the return of Christ in the second coming. The Matthian community, and the early Christian community, believed this was imminent, and so this passage speaks to the need to be vigilant, ever prepared to render an account of one's actions, even to a judge who will not readily have mercy.

While the *parousia* has not yet occurred, we can still take to hearts the Gospel's message about taking responsibility for ourselves and our actions, neither being lazy out of fear or out of complacency, an assumption that we are the chosen elect. This then becomes a reading about remaining in the moment, living life with enthusiasm and living our faith to its fullest, rather than resting on future laurels or being overly fearful in the face of the idea of judgement.
