Last Wednesday in the church's calendar we commemorated the life of the Apostle and Martyr James; each year for centuries the church has remembered James on the 25th of July. James the Great, the Elder, the brother of John, the son of Zebedee, has a fairly complete profile in the New Testament. James and John were evidently great enthusiasts and their zeal won them the title Boanerges, the sons of thunder. James was privileged, with Peter and John they witnessed the Transfiguration and it is highly significant that these three were called to be with Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane. At St. John's we will be celebrating the feast of the Transfiguration next Sunday, my last Sunday with you as your locum vicar.

James was also the first apostle to die for the Christian faith, being put to the sword by King Herod Agrippa. In no early documents, but only from the 7th century was the claim made that James preached the gospel in Spain before his martyrdom. This seems extremely unlikely and is generally rejected today. So also, outside Spain, is the separate 9th century legend which brought his relics to Santiago in Galicia. Here, however, the same relics still exist in the cathedral which was established as a principal pilgrimage centre of Western Europe. Monasteries were built along the route to provide hospitality for the pilgrims. So popular was the pilgrimage that images of St. James bear the pilgrim's hat and the scallop shell associated with Compostella.

The concept of pilgrimage is well known to us as Christians and as members of the church for we are followers of the Way that leads to fullness of life as proclaimed in the promise of the gospel. We welcome Lee this morning as she receives the sacrament of baptism and as she continues with us in the journey of faith we share as members of the church.
